Christ's resurrection



The divine powers of Jesus Christ

Following the records of the New Testament, the life of Jesus Christ still showed divine power despite being incarnated. From the conception of Mary, we can already conclude that his birth is special. To conceive without any intercourse or insemination is a miracle. It is truly a demonstration of the power of God, for being our Creator, in the creation of Jesus Christ through undefined actions.

He also manifested miracles in many forms. I will only include three dominant forms which are commonly used in discussions. First, he demonstrated miracles over nature. Christians would surely be familiar with the story when Jesus walked into the water and his disciples even mistakenly called him a ghost. Another example would include his power over animals. When Jesus commanded Peter and Andrew to cast their net into the Sea of Galilee, the two fishermen followed and caught a great number of fish. They even asked the help of James and John to gather all their catch.

Second, he performed the miracles of healing. The diseases which he covered varied and even the number of people whom he healed were not limited. Jesus healed a man that was born blind, a woman that was internally bleeding, and even healed ten lepers altogether.

Third, Jesus executed the miracle over spirits. Most of the acts were focused on the casting out of demons and one of the famous narratives happened in the land of Gerasene. A man who lived in tombs was possessed by several demons, who recognized Jesus and begged off from being tortured. The man got healed and were left by the impure spirits. Afterwards, the spirits transferred to a herd of pigs which altogether rushed to the lake and got drowned.³

Subsequently, Jesus overcame death which followed by his resurrection. If it happened to human beings, it would automatically imply a miracle. Death is the ending of all

Most importantly, he emptied his cup for the will of God to happen in Calvary. Observe like a conqueror

When you sense an ending

Death is generally perceived as a signal to an ending and can be found for example, in a book chapter, a script or better yet a person's real life. It always stirs the question of uncertainty, yet we know that it is going to be an unavoidable point in our future. When shall my time come, tomorrow, next month, or maybe a few minutes later? How will I die, dramatically or instantly? Sometimes, these questions make other people quiver, gloomy, or anxious for they do not hold any answer. Yet, don't you think it is better this way? What if you were like Jesus, who knows the specifics of his bodily death, how anxious would you get?

Death is generally perceived as a signal to an ending and can be found for example, in a book chapter, a script or better yet a person's real life.

The death of Jesus Christ

It is surreal to think that Jesus Christ would have to bear the experience of death, since he has the capacity to give or take away life. Yet, the redemption of mankind is of his own accord. Do you know how essential it is to include death in Christ's redemption?

At the priority, the gruesome death of our Savior was completed to prove the love and mercy of God to the people. As indicated in the Bible, For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believes in him shall not perish, but have everlasting life." Jesus Christ is the only begotten Son of God that was indicated in the passage, and he is the only qualified sacrifice for this to happen because He is without blemish.

Subsequent to that, Jesus Christ reflected empathy. There were manifestations where he shared physical and mental sensations with human beings. When Lazarus died, he felt sadness and even wept for his friend.² He felt tired after his travel to Samaria, and felt thirsty when he arrived at Jacob's well.³ And he rejoiced when his disciples returned from their

preaching mission and reported their success over evil forces.⁴ The ultimate test of empathy is death, since this is the most feared stage in a human's life. Jesus Christ felt this fear and anxiety as well, with the approaching time of his death. With a heavy burden, he even prayed, "Father, if it is Your will, take this cup away from Me; nevertheless not My will, but Yours, be done"⁵

Lastly, death is a requirement to the ascension of Jesus Christ, so that there will be an equilibrium. Imagine, for every immortality there will spring a new life, and for Jesus Christ that life will live eternally. He will go back and transform to his glorified form. For the Bible said, "but because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them."

When you do your tasks for Christ

Imagine you were in a typical office, and you were assigned a task but the deadline is not announced? Your boss will just tell you, "Finish the task and be prepared when I return." At first, you were so eager to work and by the same day you already completed half of it. On the next day, you were so busy that you totally forgot about your special task. It went on for weeks and you find no sign of your boss. Your task remained the same, no progress and only half fulfilled. One day, you heard a familiar voice. Your boss finally came! He approached you and asked, "Where is the outcome of the task I gave you?"

Christians would most likely find this situation familiar. When Jesus Christ ascended, the scripture said, "Heaven must receive him until the time comes for God to restore everything, as he promised long ago through his holy prophets." This short passage has many implications. If you will observe, it was mentioned that there will be a restoration. However, it will not be fulfilled immediately. The phrase "until the time comes" connotes a waiting phase. Also, you cannot restore anything that is not shattered or broken. This implied the destruction of Jerusalem, as indicated by the words of Jesus, "Do you see all these things?" he asked. "I tell you the truth, not one stone here will be left on another; everyone will be thrown down."

Another would be the second coming of Jesus Christ. This will be the sign that the second kingdom will be restored, and it has been prophesied many times that Christ will return. According to the Bible, "This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven." In Israel, this act can be compared to the Day of Atonement, which is a culminating
